This section states the different housing options that the school offers. Many schools offer a variety of housing options. A description of the different housing options is found below.

Apartment – Apartment housing means that the school will either 1) largely assist you in finding or 2) provide you with apartment-style housing. Apartment details vary on location but they usually include a kitchen and are located fairly close to campus. Roommates are either students from your host country attending your university or other international students.

Campus Housing – This is housing provided by your university. Your host university will help you find a room on campus with either students from your host university or other international students. Rooms on campus may or may not include a kitchen.

Home Stay – Home stay-style housing means that you will be staying with a family from your host country. Home stay hosts may or may not speak English, so this is a good way for you to practice the language of your host country!

Independent Housing – Independent Housing means that students find housing themselves. Often times, the university will be able to provide assistance on how to find housing in your host country.

Part 2: Program Description

Introduction

Program Description:

The University of Oviedo is one of the oldest universities in Spain. It started its teaching activity 400 years ago, in 1608. Throughout its history, the University has gone through different stages, being especially relevant the period going from the end of the 19th century to the beginning of the 20th century, when University outreach was born, and the University of Oviedo was consolidated as one of the best universities in Spain. In the last few decades, the University has gone through its most important changes, which implied an increase of degrees, faculty and research activities, which place our university among the top universities in Spain.



Nowadays we have campuses in three cities (Oviedo, Gijon, and Mieres), structured in 11 faculties, 5 higher technical schools and 5 associated centres, with more than 2000 professors and 1000 administrative staff which provide assistance to more than 27000 students and to the Asturian society in general.

In 2009, thanks to the project of the University of Oviedo Ad Futurum. From the 17th to the 21st Century: Looking back, looking ahead our University became a Campus of International Excellence, in the first initiative within the University Strategy 2015, which is aimed at modernizing Spanish universities and improving their internationalization and specialization.

Housing

There are 3 different types of accommodations: Accommodation with families, Residence Halls, Rented flats shared with other students. The price for a room in a shared flat goes from 200 - 250 Euros a month, whereas staying with a family may cost around 600 Euros, in a single room with laundry and food included in the price. Renting a two room furnished flat can be approximately 600 Euros. The University of Oviedo has three Residence Halls. The price per person in a single room is about 399 Euros a month. The price per person for a double room could be 311 Euros without food.

Tuition

Tuition

The University of Oviedo is an exchange partner of CSM. Talk to CSM OIP for details.

The "Tuition" section states the tuition of the school. Keep in mind, if the school is an *exchange partner*, you will pay tuition to CSM (all financial aid applies), and you will pay \$160 in fees. (The money that would have gone towards paying the rest of your fees here at Mines should help with covering airfare.) If the school is a *study abroad partner*, you will still pay \$160 in fees. However, you will pay tuition directly to the host university. *You will not pay Mines tuition.* The cost of host university tuition varies among the different study abroad partners.

Host University Application

Host University Application

The University of Oviedo asks that applications are submitted through a student's home university study abroad office. The student will fill out the required documentation, and CSM OIP will submit your application.

Fall Application Deadline: May 30

Spring Application Deadline: November 15

The application process varies among the different host universities. Some schools ask that CSM submits your application on your behalf. Some schools ask that you submit your application online through their application portal. In both cases, you must first submit your online TerraDotta application to CSM OIP. Once accepted to Mines OIP, we will direct you on applying to your host university. Be aware: sometimes your host university application deadline is before the CSM deadline. If this is the case: 1) APPLY EARLY, and 2) talk to CSM OIP before submitting your CSM TerraDotta application so that we can expedite your application decision. Applications to CSM OIP are done on a rolling basis.
